The Fair Board has set forth the following rules: "**Check In: Thursday** : 1:00pm-9:00pm (at gate entrance by the back barns), **Friday** : 8:00am-9:00pm (Manzanita Building), **Sat**: 7:00am-8:30am (Manzanita Building).

At check in: You will need a picture ID card to check-in. You will be given a wristband (if lost please inform security or faire staff immediately) Wristbands MUST be worn at all times. You will be given a parking pass and directed where to park after setting up. **Camping:** You will need to pay for RV spots \$15 per night hook-up (cash only), RV spots are reserved prior to the event, please contact Lissa. You will need to pay for electricity hook-up for tent camping if you plan to use electricity which is \$10 per night (cash only), otherwise tent camping is free. **Other Stuff:** You will be asked to sign a liability waiver and notification of rules.

Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by their parent/guardian to sign the waiver, minors are not to be left on the grounds without parent/guardian. ALL Cars off lot by 9:00AM Saturday. **Participants who show up after gates open will have to pay full gate fees, unless otherwise arranged prior to the event."**
