• We must receive your reservation and payment in full in order to complete your reservation.

Progress Pointers

- Fill out the registration form, submit payment online at the end of the registration process. If you choose to mail your payment please print a copy of your registration form that you receive via email to the address indicated.
- We will not contact you unless there is a question regarding your reservation. Please be certain to include your email address in the event we need to contact you.
- Camping spaces will be available starting 5:00PM Thursday and may be occupied until 10:00AM Monday. All campsites are dry spaces only.
- After June 1, 2017, spaces will be assigned by the date of receipt of your reservation. In the event there are no spaces available that meet your needs, your check will be returned.
- If you do not make a reservation before May 10, 2017, or if you arrive without a reservation and we are able to accommodate you, fees will increase by \$5.00 per night.
- Open flame fires as the result of burning paper, cardboard, wood or similar material are prohibited. Charcoal fires in metal containers and propane camp stoves are permitted. Completely enclosed fires are permitted subject to individual approval in advance.

Last year Her Grace and Lady Fleming brought to our attention the free online course, 'A History of Royal Food and Feasting', sponsored by Future Learn.



Although this course, created by the University of Reading, focuses on the monarchs and nobility of England, the information can be applied to our own court as well. This course is not limited to details of dining but expands beyond to include many interesting historical facts about the monarchs, their support staff, and food and spice sourcing over the centuries. A tidbit from the course and a good refresher for us all!

"The Tudors had other strict rules when eating at court, some of which were recorded by the Dutch Writer, Desiderius Erasmus, who published his *De Civitate* in 1534:

- 1. Sit not down until you have washed.
- 2. Undo your belt a little if it will make you more comfortable; because doing this during the meal is bad manners.
- 3. When you wipe your hands clean, put good thoughts forward in your mind, for it doesn't do to come to dinner sad, and thus make others sad.
- 4. Once you sit place your hands neatly on the table; not on your trencher, and not around your belly.
- 5. Don't shift your buttocks left and right as if to let off some blast. Sit neatly and still.
- 6. Any gobbit that cannot be taken easily with the hand, take it on your trencher.
- 7. Don't wipe your fingers on your clothes; use the napkin or the board cloth'.
- 8. If someone is ill mannered by ignorance, let it pass rather than point it out.

 Although Mary engaged in each of these activities at one time or another, horseback riding was the one exercise she made time for every day. Imagine the guard's frustrations when she was gone up to three hours at a time-alone!

2. False. While Mary was crowned Queen of Scots at the tender age of nine months at Stirling Castle, she was prevented from observing Mass anywhere but Holyroodhouse per the terms of an agreement she made with her brother, Lord James. The compromise was made to maintain the religious status quo where Protestantism was recognized as Scotland's official religion even if the majority of people were still privately Catholic.

3. Mary hired her own fool or court jester, a woman named Nichola, or "La Jardinière, whom she brought back from France and with whom she loved to banter.
