

We will be having our annual "Dining In" on the 18th March and I look forward to seeing you all there. Please remember this is a Guards only event.


The Lady Dame Raven will be continuing as Steward of the Royal Guard this year, so please look for missives from her and be prudent to respond to her requests.



My name is bord James Stewart, Head of the Courtier/Ambassador Household. Many of you may know me, some of you may not. For those who don't know me, as long as you are a reasonable member of my household, I am a patient and understanding Head of Household. If you are kind of a pain in the neek, you'll find I am a patient and understanding Head of Household. If you are a total jackass, you'll find I am a patient and understanding Head of Household...until you turn your back on me, and then I'll bust a chair over your head.

As a living history organization, I feel our first duty at St. Andrews is to be teachers of history. There are a few ways we can do this.

First, we need to learn history ourselves. We can do this through research, through attending Guildhouse meetings, and through attending the training classes which will this faire season be held throughout the year. Read as much as you can about the country, the period and the characters we represent. Discuss what you learn with other guild members at Guildhouse nights and at the trainings. It's okay if we don't totally agree about that history. There are as many different versions of history as there are points of view. You might find your opinions on Scotland in 1562 will evolve and change over time, as mine have.

Second, we as teachers need to share what we've learned. The obvious place for doing this is at faires, but an equally important venue is the school presentations we give during the week. Having done a couple of these presentations, I can heartily recommend them. To be in a classroom with a group of inquisitive students is to remember the real reason we do this. Sure, it's fun to put on period garb and speak with an accent, but our true value to society is the

ability impart the knowledge of history we have collected over time.

Finally, remember we represent the individuals we portray. For some of our patrons, the only information they will ever be exposed to about renaissance Scotland is our portrayals. That is a responsibility I take extremely seriously, and I hope you do as well.

Just a very brief note to welcome everyone to our new season! 2006 promises to be a wonderful year, full of familiar events, and new experiences — renewed friendships, and new family.



Guide to the Scots by David Ross®

Pawky and Dour

Two adjectives from their own form of the English language haunt the Scots. One is "pawky", the other is "dour". Naturally, they mean opposite things. Pawky is defined in the dictionary as "tricky, artful; dryly humorous". The pawky Scot is a person with a droll grin and wisecrack to accompany it. The dour Scot is a person with a grim _expression, a grim mind and a grim turn of phrase to accompany it. It is a special Scottish talent to combine both characteristics within the same person.

3 Guidelines for Portraying an Sistorical Character 80

Preface:

Portraying a person who lived during the life and times of Mary, Queen of Scots can be a rewarding, yet demanding task. This is not for everyone. In large part one is restricted based on the facts and events associated with ones character. Certain deviations from history will generally be needed; such deviations generally will have to do with why ones character was at court or in relationship to a particular event in history.

The intent of the guidelines is to clearly discuss the requirements for playing an historical character. Please review the guidelines, and follow the instructions for submitting an historical character profile and request.

Relevance:

- * The character must be a person who lived during the life of Mary, Queen of Scots.
- . The character must have lived in Scotland, England, Ireland or Europe.
- The character must have an historical basis for his or her existence.
- The character must have a logical reason for being on progress, in Scotland, or at the court of Mary, Queen of Scots.
- The character may not be a duplicate of a character already being portrayed by another guild that is likely to be at the same event(s) as St. Andrews.

Who Must Apply:


If you did not portray the particular historical character last year within St. Andrews you must apply.

Requirements for Playing an Historical Character:

- One must be at least 13 years old.
- One must be able to portray ones character accurately based on research one has conducted.
- One must submit reference materials relating to ones character based on research from factually based documents. No novels or other works of fiction.
- One must have the acting ability necessary to portray ones character.
- One must possess the necessary creativity required to integrate ones character into gigs and performances.
- One must be willing to stay in character from the beginning of the day until faire closes.
- One must have the ability to dress and look the part of ones character.
- . One must be able to consistently attend the majority of faires throughout the season.
- One must be willing to meet with the Historical Character Committee to review ones request and to discuss ones vision of the character. NOTE: Depending upon the character one wishes to portray, one may be asked to describe oneself to the committee "in character."

flow to Apply:

- Use research to develop an "historically" based biographical profile of the selected character.
- Obtain, complete and submit a Character Portrayal Request.
- Submit the request either online, via mail, or in person to a member of the "Historical Character Committee." Sir Prew MacQuain, Sir James Mossman & Dame Bronwynne Melville head this committee and can help you with any questions you have.
- Schedulg a time to meet with the committee.


